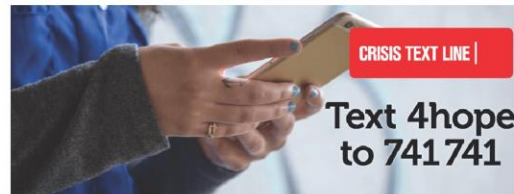

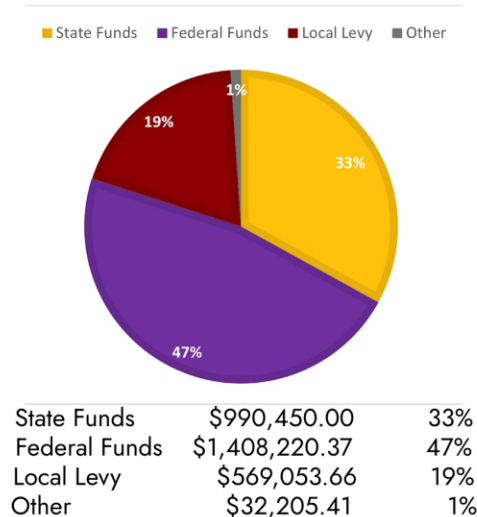
Mission

Vision

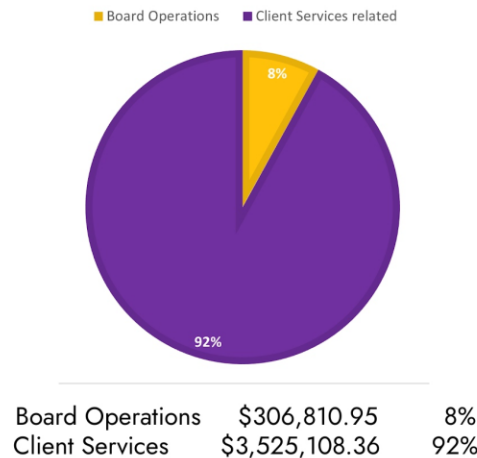
For Huron County to be a community where all individuals are mentally and emotionally healthy and free from dependence on harmful substances and/or addictive behaviors.
