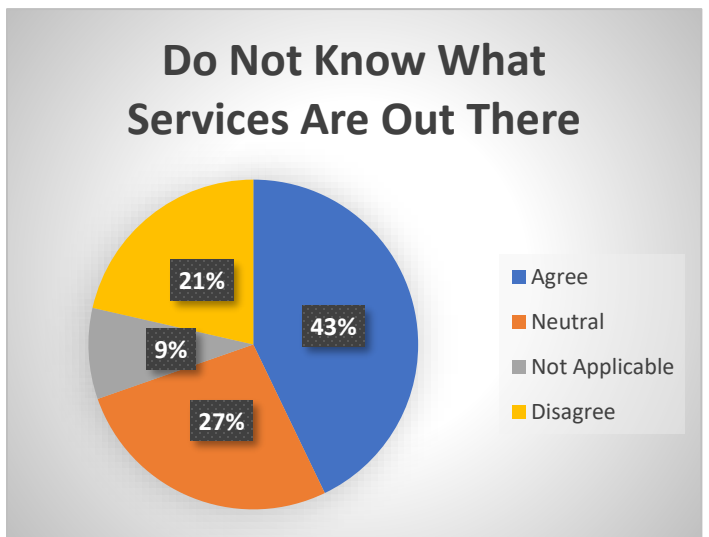
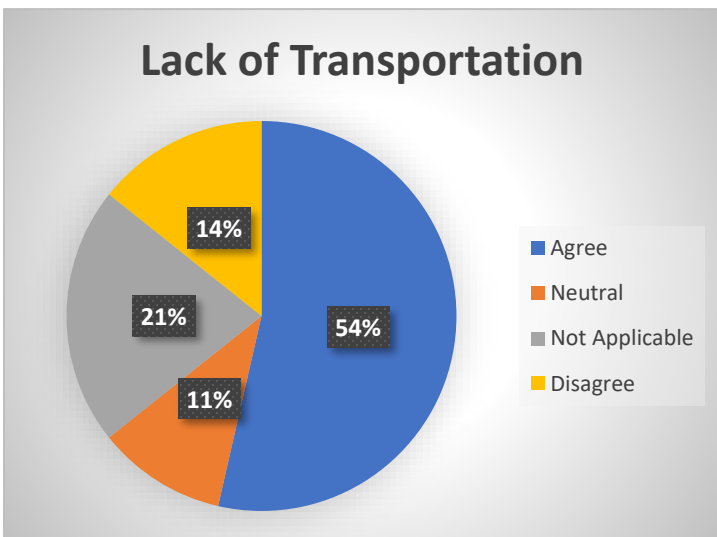
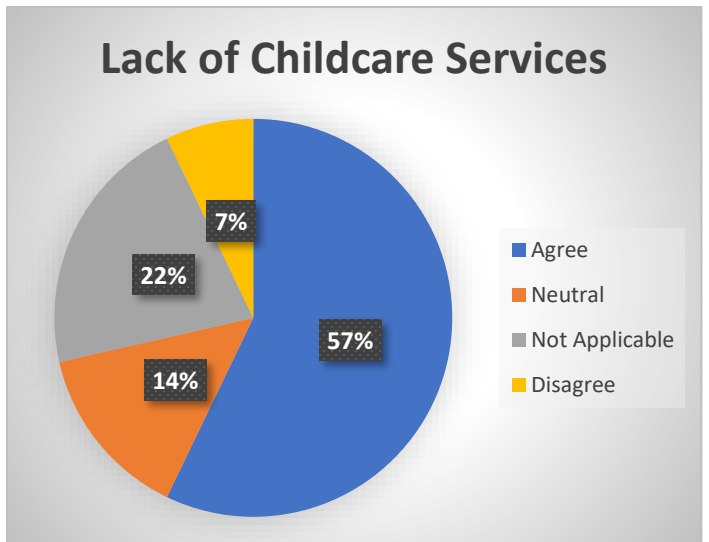
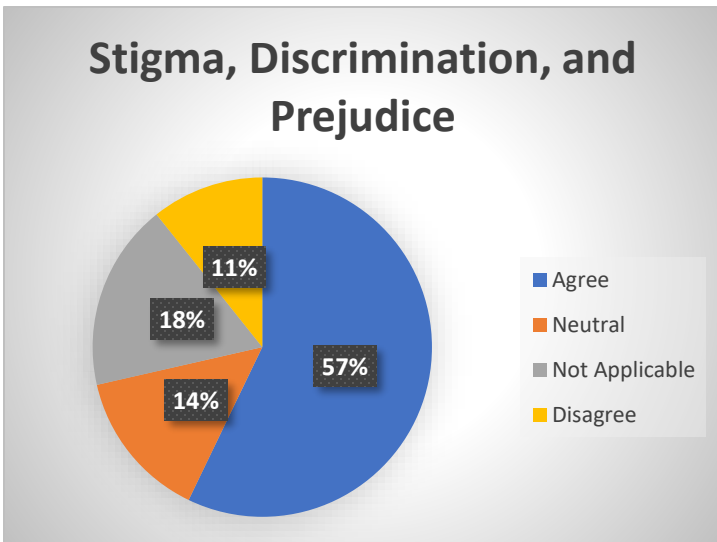
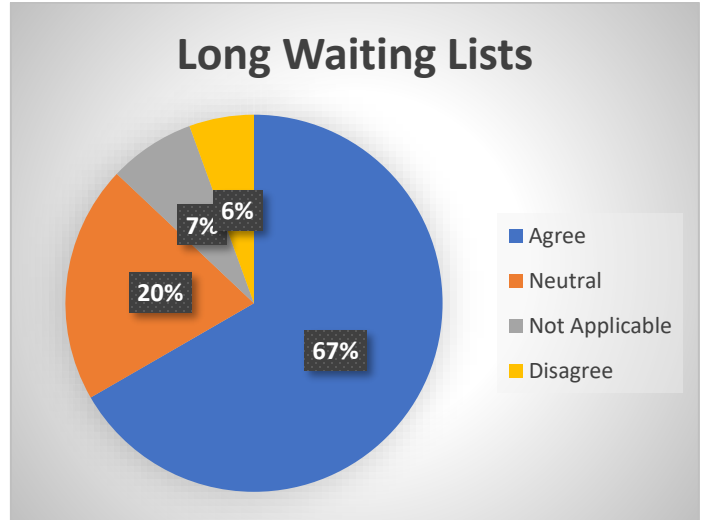
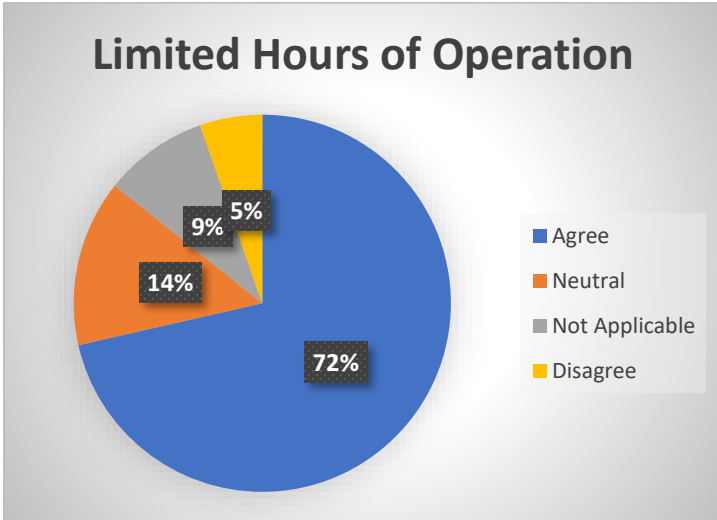
Question 1: From the following list, which do you think are the top 3 most pressing problems/issues in your community?



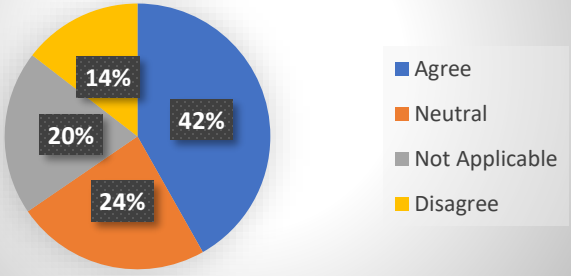
Question 2: What are the top three barriers when accessing behavioral health services?



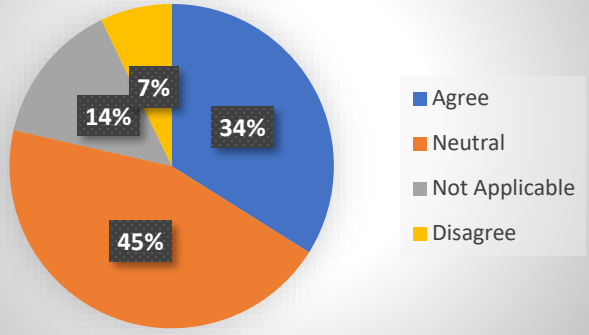
Question 3: How much do you agree/disagree that the following keep you and/or a family member from getting help with needed mental health or substance use services?



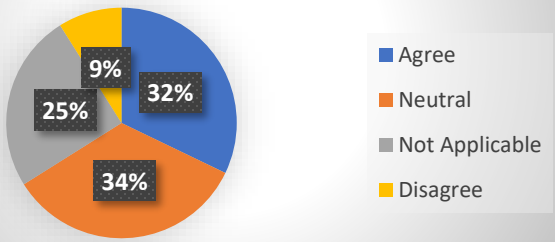

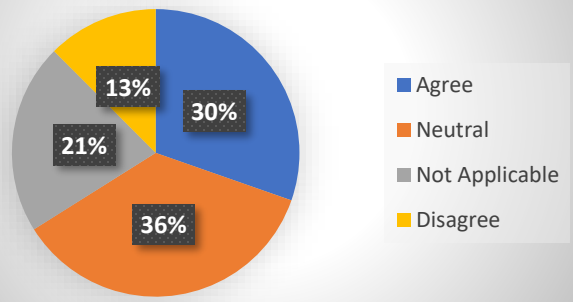

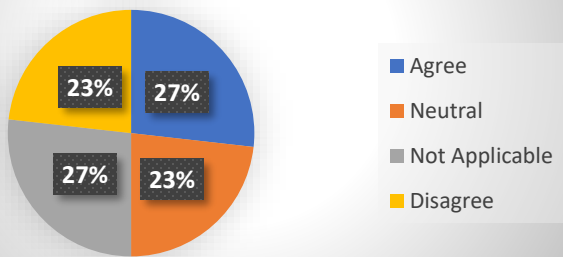

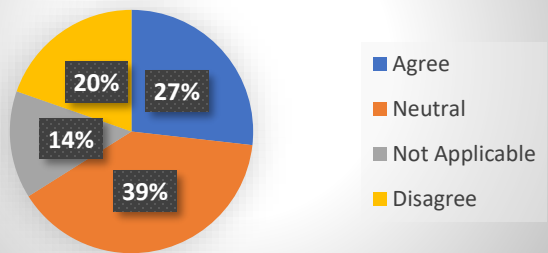

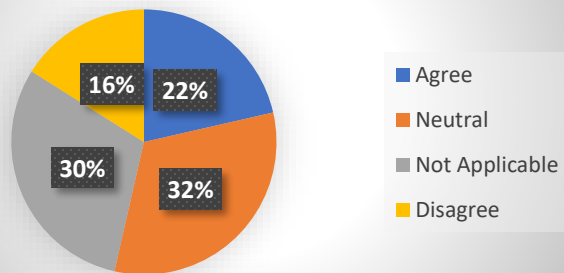
Do Not Have a Permanent Address



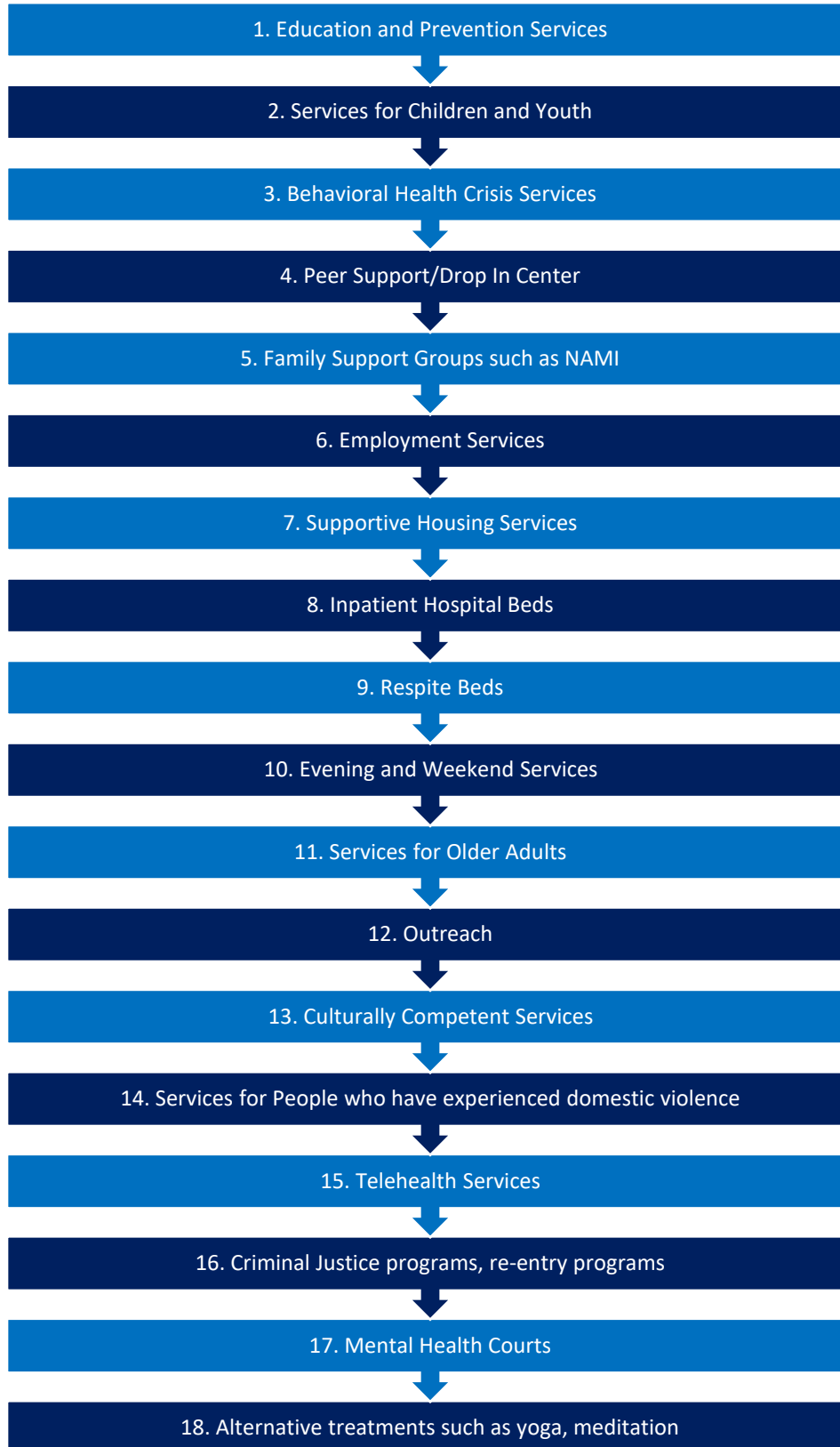

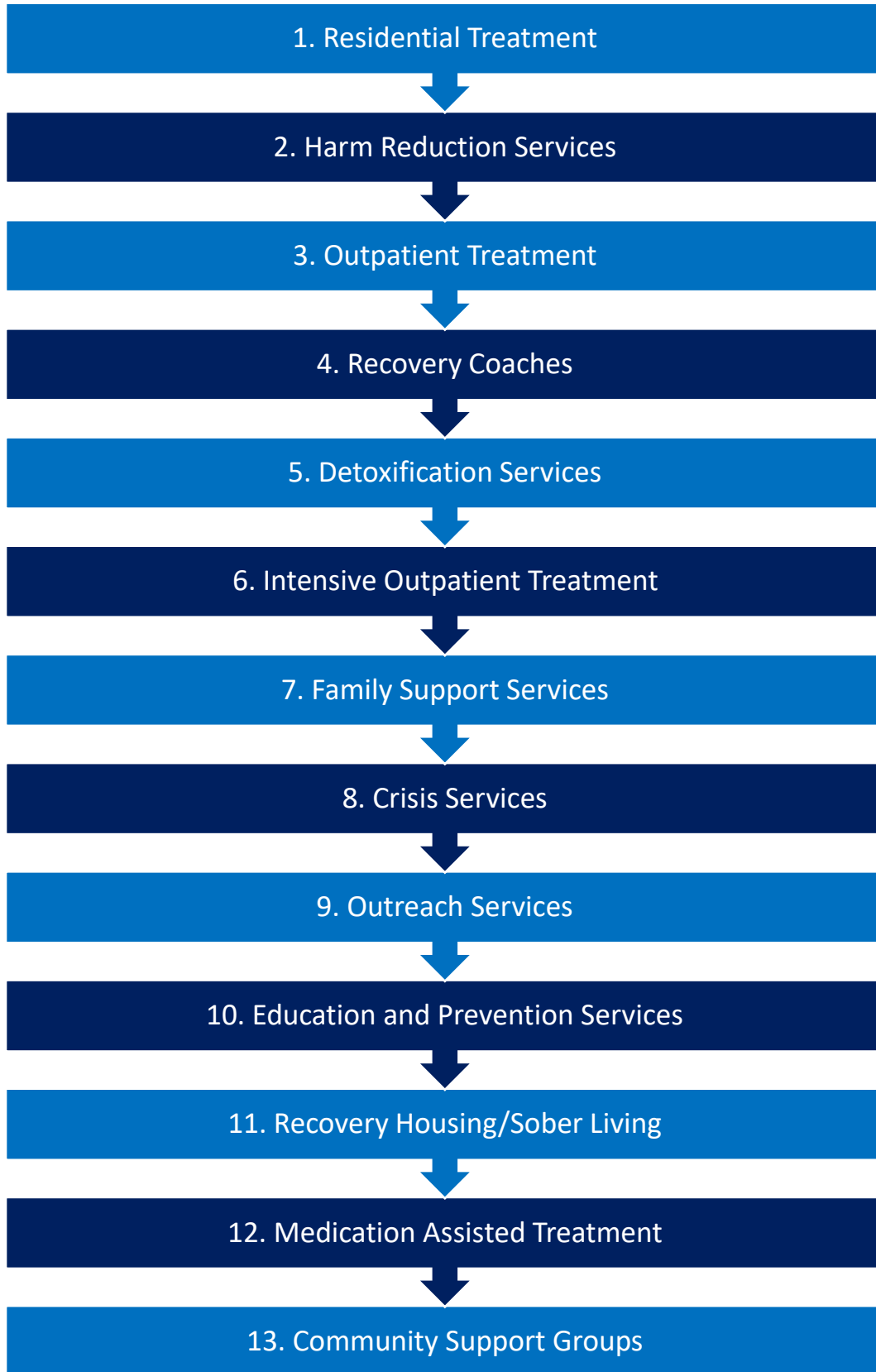


Question 4: What mental health services are missing, or do we need more of in the county? (Ranked by priority)



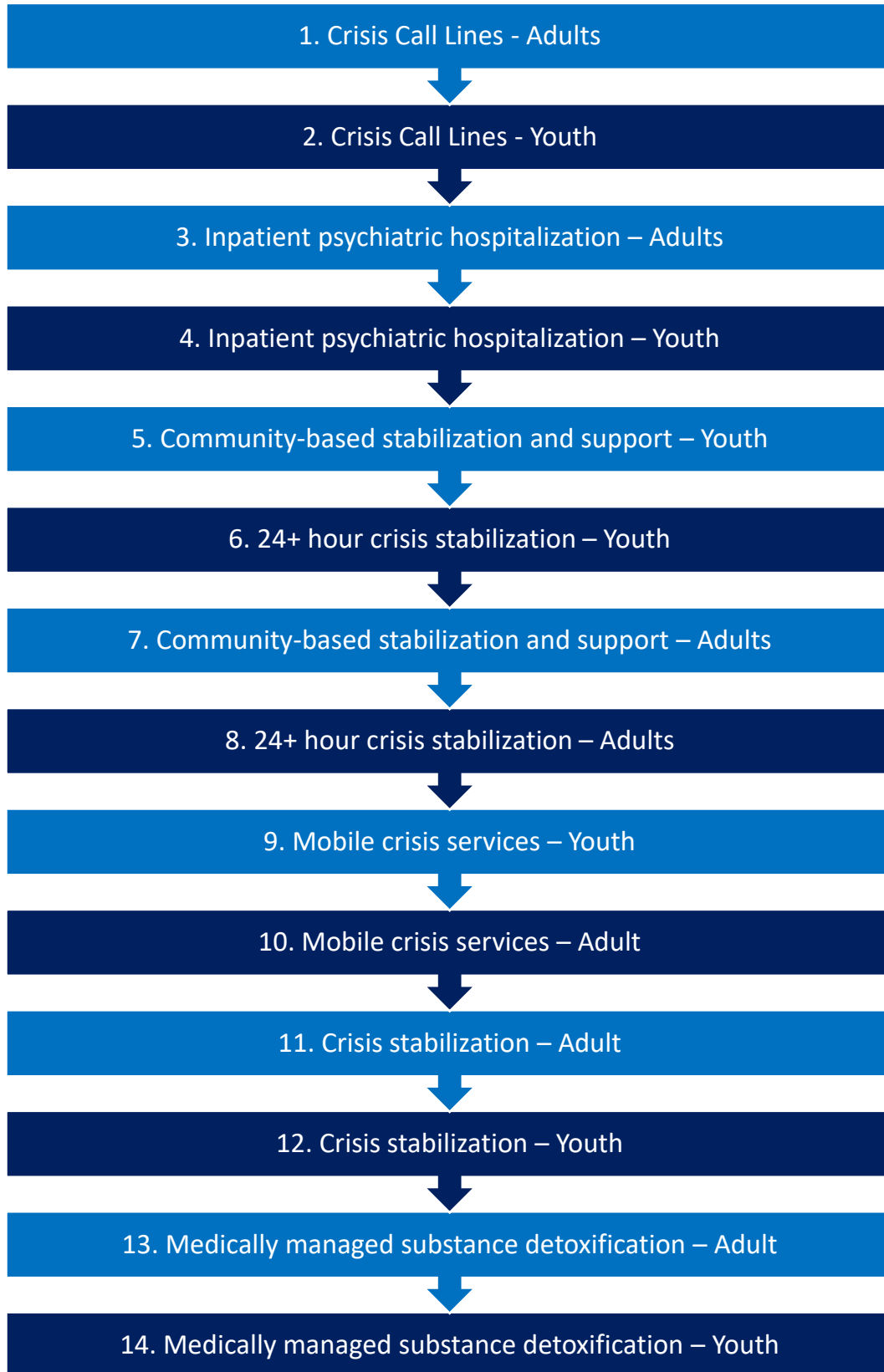
Various individuals stated that Huron County’s mental health services are improving and or remarkably effective.

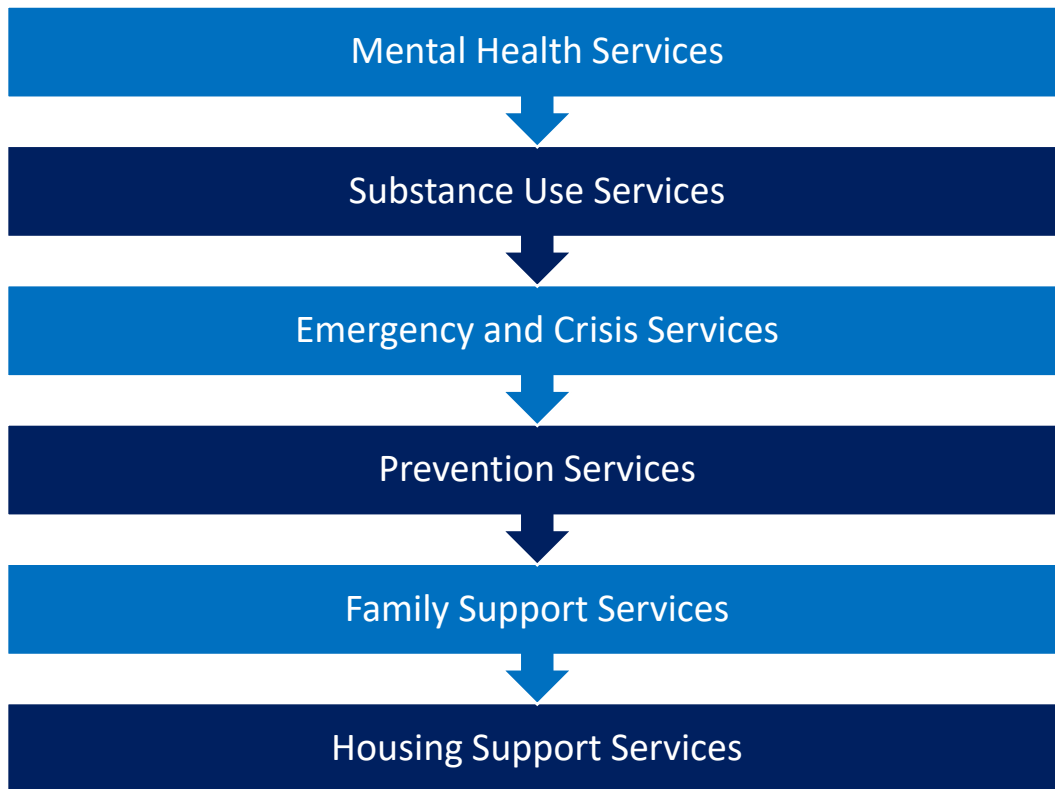
Question 10: What do you think are the major strengths of the behavioral health system & services in Huron County?
